

# eSTB Data Match Criteria

After the surety/surety agent files an eSTB with CBP, the customs broker must transmit the entry via ACE Cargo Release. CBP will match the entry with the eSTB using the following data elements:

**1. Importer Number**

**2. Entry Number**

**3. Surety Code**

**4. Bond Amount**

**5. Entry Type Code**

# Common Rejects


ACE Cargo Release entries will be rejected if any of the five data elements in the entry do not match those in the eSTB data.

To remedy a reject:

1. The entry must be corrected to match the eSTB data, or
2. The eSTB must be voided and then re-transmitted with corrected data to match the entry data.

After resolving the discrepancy, the entry can then be resubmitted in ACE.
